	<b>7-July, 23:10</b> - Highland Light Infantry of Canada Battalion HQ closes down at Villons- les-Buissons and moves to Le Vey 23:30 hrs. ( <i>closer to the 8 July start-line</i> ). Weather is clear, cool & visibility good. Morale is 100%. Men are anxious to get at the enemy in Buron who have mortared and shelled them for over one month.
	<b>8-July, 05:00</b> - H.L.I. of C. Battalion is awakened by a terrific barrage along the whole corps front. Germans open up with strong counter-battery fire and drop many into assembly area. Battalion members in Le Vey area, are obliged to shelter in slit trenches.
<b>05:30</b> - Artillery fire on position of II./25 SS-Panzer-Grenadiers ( <i>in Glamanche</i> ) moves from front to rear of their position ( <i>implies attack is imminent</i> .)

	<b>21:30</b> – Canadian Scottish occupy Cussy.
	Nightfall – St. Contest finally cleared.
	Although Buron was occupied by the H.L.I. of C., it and the over-run SS positions north of Buron were not completely cleared and secured until the next day.
<b>Overnight</b> – Those German defenders who are able to escape, abandon those objectives which have not already been captured by the allies in an effort to establish a new defensive line across the Orne River.	<b>Overnight and the next day, July</b> 9 <sup>th</sup> – The Canadians have achieved all of their objectives either by force of arms or by the German defenders abandoning their positions overnight. Those remnants and snipers unable to escape are mopped up on the 9 <sup>th</sup> .
Casualties of SS-Panzergrenadier Regiment 25 on July 8, 1944 as reported:	to escape are mopped up on the 7 .
KIA: 5 officers, 19 NCOs, 86 enlisted. WIA: 1 officer, 20 NCOs, 116 enlisted. MIA: 8 officers, 43 NCOs, 410 enlisted."	

The divisional history states 410 as total casualty figure for 7th & 8th July so either the divisional or the regimental record is in error.

## What to learn from the above reports:

Combat is fluid.

When an attacking force reports having 'entered', 'occupied' or 'secured' and objective formerly occupied by its enemies, it does not mean that the objective has been completely 'cleared' of the enemy. Pockets of resistance may remain and may commonly have been left behind during a 'break-through' or 'overrun'. This is especially true in built-up areas where every space in every building has to be searched and cleared.

This is so unlike any computer, miniature or board wargame.
